Week 6 - "Valleys" - Psalm 23:1-4

"The Lord is my Shepherd, I have everything I need. He makes me lie down in green pastures; He leads me beside still waters. He restores my soul He leads me in the right paths for his name's sake. Even when I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me!" – Psalm 23:1-4

The Valley of Siddim

"Then the four kings of Shinar, the king of Babylon, the king of Ellsar, Elam and Gooim went to war against the five kings of Sodom, Gomorrah and three other cities. The five kings joined forces in the valley of Siddim which is now the Dead Sea. For twelve years they'd been oppressed by other kingdoms, so in the thirteenth year, they rebelled. But in the fourteenth year their oppressor recruited his allies to team up and reconquer the land." – Genesis 14:1-5

"Now this valley was full of sticky tar pits. When the kings of Sodom and Gomorrah tried to run away from the battle, they slipped and they fell and they got stuck in the pits. So the invaders plundered the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah and they took everything they had. They also captured Abraham's nephew, Lot, who was living in Sodom." – Genesis 14:10-12

The Valley of Eshcol

"Then the spies came to the Valley of Eshcol. The fruit was so abundant that they cut off a grape branch which had a giant cluster of grapes on it, but it was so large and heavy that it took two men to carry it back on a pole between them. They also brought samples of beautiful pomegranates and figs." – Numbers 13:23 (LB)

“This was their report to Moses: ‘It is indeed a magnificent country, rich and fertile and here’s some fruit as proof. But the people living there are powerful and they’re stronger than we are and they look like giants to us, in our own eyes, we felt as small as grasshoppers next to them. Saul and the Israelites camped in the Valley of Elah and they drew up a battle plan to fight the Philistines. The Philistines and the Israelites each stood their ground, shouting and taunting each other from opposite hills, with the Valley of Elah between them. Now the Philistine army had a giant champion fighter, named Goliath who was about nine feet tall and when Saul and the Israelites saw this, they were terrified and deeply shaken.” – 1 Samuel 17:2-4, 11 (NIV)

Elah is the valley of conflict: When you’re facing a giant challenge.

“The Philistines occupied one hill and the Israelites another, with the Valley of Elah between them.” – 1 Samuel 17:3

The Valley of BACA (Weeping)

“Blessed are those whose strength comes from the Lord as they pass through the Valley of Baca, the valley of weeping, they make it a place of springs.” – Psalm 84:5-7
